President's Message

It is with great pleasure I write this message to the newsletter. The first three months of the year was smooth and managed without difficulties according to the proposed calendar at the beginning. However, as you all understand the COVID crisis made us to travel in a different direction with the difficult situations in the country. However, I hope the members of the council had to take immediate and various alternative measures in providing maternity care in the country without much of disturbances. During these crisis period we all had to face difficulties which we have not faced before and some of them were very challenging and difficult decisions taken with the consensus of the council. In March a safe motherhood program was conducted in Trincomalee Hospital with the perception of many



senior and junior members of the College and I like to thank Dr. Rasika Herath for organizing it in a grand way and I also like to thank Dr. Darshana and Dr. Ziard two consultants in the Trincomalee hospital for providing all the support for the success.

Few members of the council met DGHS and convinced him to get Neville Fernando hospital for admitting suspected COVID patients and Colombo east hospital was selected for COVID positive pregnant mothers. All other hospitals were prepared with isolation wards for the above purposes. I like to thank the administration and our colleagues in supporting this process to make it a success in managing these mothers without any adverse outcome. We also had few meetings with the officials of the FHB and some task force meetings with DGHS and members of the other colleges. There were two emergency council meetings with zoom technology to take some important decisions. The College managed to provide personal protective equipment to the members all over the country and this distribution was done with the help of pharma companies and I like to thank them for assisting us to make it a success.

The public were educated about the provision of maternity care with alternative effective ways without making them vulnerable for increased risk of morbidity during this crisis. The College used mass media like television messages, Face Book and print media in this maneuver successfully. Clinic records were allowed to use as curfew passes with the help of the IGP during this crisis period. However, there were five maternal deaths directly related to the panic situation in the country during these 3 months period. At this moment I like to thank all those who have supported the College to maintain the uninterrupted maternity care during this period.

After initial lock down we managed to open the College premises for business as usual and conducted few webinars for the members and the post graduates. I like to thank Dr. Mangala Dissanayake for organizing and Dr. Dhammike Silva for conducting very important webinar series of laparoscopic surgeries. I hope our membership and the postgraduate trainees have gained a lot of information by listening to them. I also had great opportunity in participating in several webinars conducted by SLCOG, SAFOG, AOFOG and FIGO during this period and shown the international counter parts of our role during this period.

A meeting was held to discuss the feasibility of having a cordial relationship with RANZCOG in July and decision was made to sign a MOU with SLCOG and RANZCOG to share experience and exchanging post graduate trainees

and other important academic activities in the future. The achievement was made a success due to an initial discussion I had with current President RANZCOG Dr. Vijay Roach in London during last RCOG sessions.

In this year three guidelines, namely heart disease, liver disease complicating pregnancy and hypertensive disease in pregnancy will be revised with the participation of many college members and experts in other specialties. This will be funded by the WHO. A webinar series will be organized in association with RCOG liaison group starting from 30th August on every Sunday evening till November 2020. I cordially invite you to listen to them to acquire latest information on new subjects. Dr. Mangala Dissanayake and Dr. Rajkumar are the coordinators for the series. A safe motherhood program is scheduled to be held in early October in Monaragala and I invite the membership to participate in this program to help the periphery to improve knowledge and skills in maternity care.

The planned SAFOG-SLCOG conference in October had to be postponed due the prevailing situation and SLCOG is planning to have its annual conference in December this year at Galadari Hotel, Colombo. I invite you to participate in it actively to make it a very successful conference as there is no possibility in getting foreign speakers for the session this time. I wish you all good health and good luck.


College contributions during COVID-19 pandemic

President

Donated 400 PPEs (Personal Protective Equipment), Hood caps, N95 Masks to SLCOG membership and their relevant wards with the support of relatives and sponsors.

Discussions was held and arrangements were made to open up NFTH (Nevile Fernando Teaching Hospital), Mulleriyawa Base Hospital, KDU Teaching Hospital to facilitate perinatal care for suspected COVID-19 positive pregnant mothers and communication was done to transfer patients to above hospitals.

President and the Guideline Committee prepared a guideline for "Management of suspected and confirmed COVID-19 in pregnancy" and a flyer in all 3 languages



regarding the measures of prevention of COVID-19 and what to do in emergency situation, and it was published in the SLCOG website and other social media.

SLCOG initiated a hotline for pregnant mothers to clarify their issues during this crisis period, with the help of Mobitel. Prof Athula Kaluarachchi supervised this during this period and Senior Registrars and Registrars of De Soysa Maternity Hospital (DMH) and Castle Street Women's Hospital (CSWH) contributed for this timely needed task. Hotline was published in the electronic and social media.

Initial arrangements were taken to look after the antenatal period of pregnant mothers in view of accessibility and transport feasibility.

In collaboration with Family Health Bureau, measures were taken to uplift the maternal care.

President and few other council members also participated in media briefing about care of pregnant mother during pandemic of COVID-19.

Active involvement and technical support were provided to COVID-19 Task Force in relation to issues with antenatal, intrapartum and postnatal care in this crisis situation and also about RE-OPEN strategy when the pandemic gets eased off.

We thank our members for making local preparations for prevention and isolation of suspected mothers with limited availability in their hospitals and for strengthening antenatal, intrapartum, postpartum care to minimize pregnancy related complications.

President-elect Dr. Pradeep de Silva, and Prof. Hemantha Dodampahala representing the College and the National Research Council advised the COVID-19 Task Force, and emphasized the value of face masking, distancing and thermal checking, and in case of a COVID outbreak how it should be handled by the hospitals, at district level. The facts were well received and appreciated by the COVID-19 Task Force.

The app was handed over to Prime Minister together with the Robot Nursing Officer at his residence.

It's with great pleasure that I write this message to the newsletter after the COVID-19 outbreak in Sri Lanka. I hope that all our members are doing well and staying safe. I am proud to announce that, with great difficulty, the SLCOG Ladies Forum was able to conduct its 2nd event for the year last August at the Mullegama Maha Vidyalaya in Athurugiriya.

We visited the Mullegama Maha Vidyalaya in Athurugiriya on the 26th of August 2020. This is a mixed school with around 500 children from low-income population, with very poor resource allocation from the government. The Principal, Vice Principal and staff are in the process of uplifting the school and we are happy that we were able to help them.

We were able to donate around Rs.100,000/- worth of items to the school for the home science subject, and money for prizes for the best performing students at the next O/L examination. In addition, we were able to attended to repairs of the broken chairs which were kept at a corner of the school, thus enabling them to be used at school functions.
